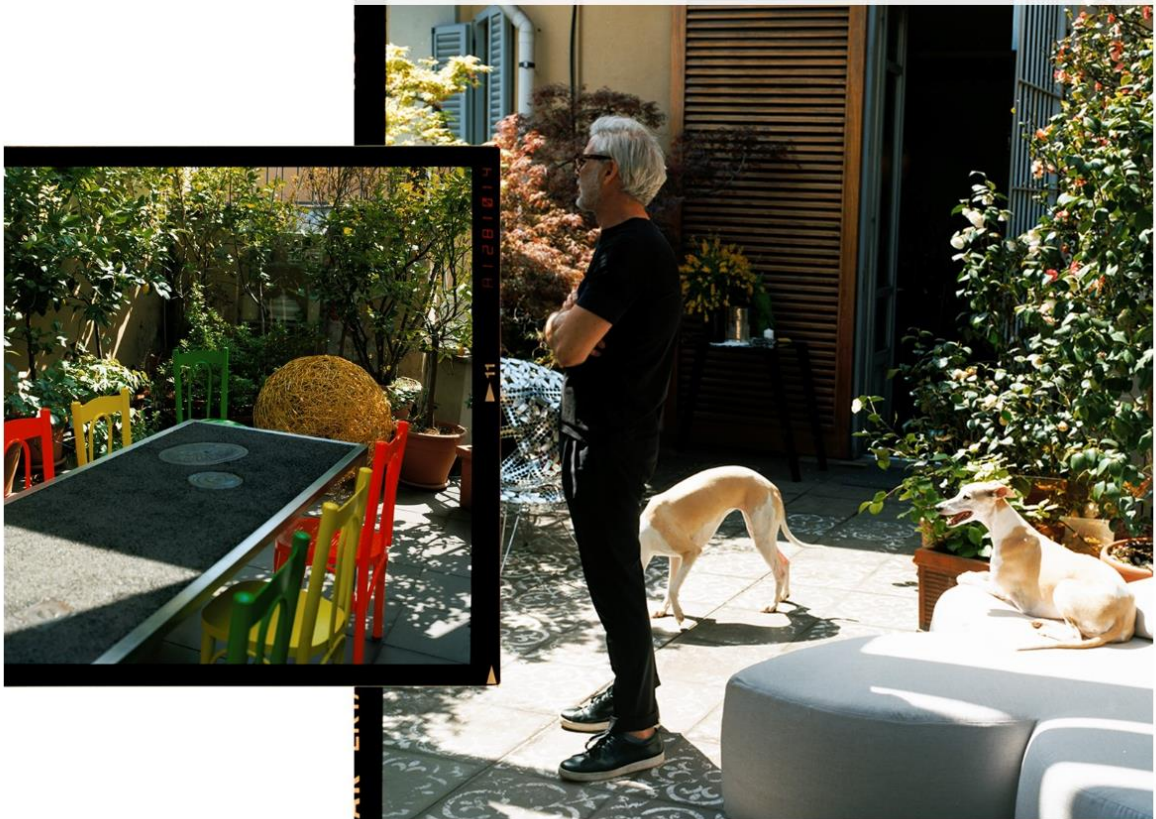

8. Samer Alameen: In-House

Inside, he showed furniture of his own design, like jigsaw-esque seating and coffee tables, and Meccano-inspired shelving.
